Top Attractions

- **Real Alcázar** (tickets: <https://www.alcazarsevilla.org>)

Royal palace of Islamic origin, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- **Seville Cathedral** (tickets: <https://www.catedraldesevilla.es>)

One of the largest Gothic cathedrals in the world.

- **Plaza de España**

An architectural icon and one of the most photographed spots in the city.

- **Santa Cruz Quarter (recommended a freetour)**

The old Jewish quarter with narrow streets and historic charm.

- **Metropol Parasol (Las Setas)**

A modern observation deck with panoramic views.

Recommendation: Dedicate 2–3 days to explore Seville in depth.

Tip: Book in advance, especially during peak season.

Day Trip: Córdoba (45 min – 1h by train)

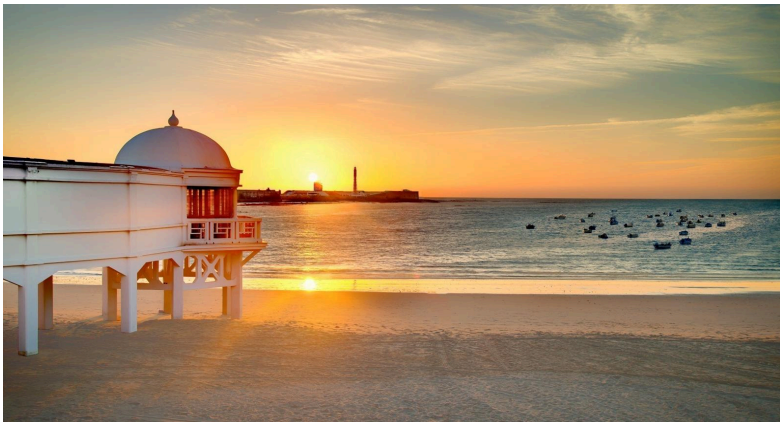
